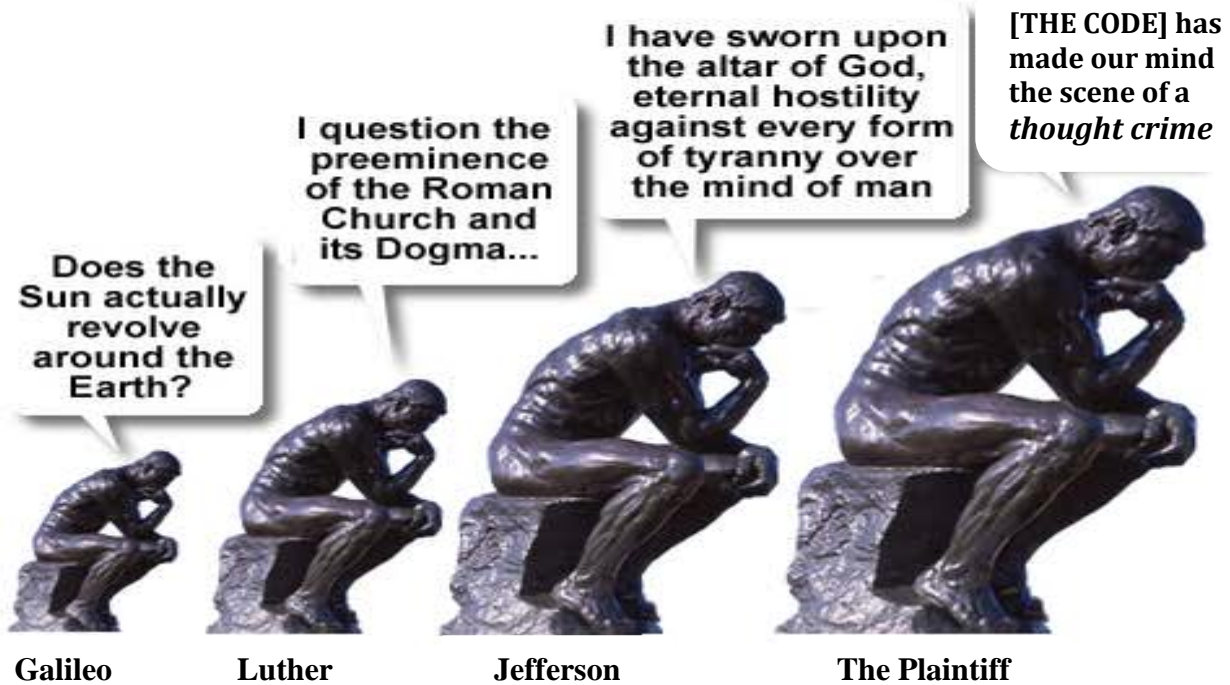

**TITLE 26 U.S.C. INTERNAL REVENUE CODE is more moralistic than mathematical**

It how your own values, manner, character, and proper behavior can create a debt that could put you in jail for failing to make a proper return to an IRS' path of life, beliefs and practices, thus being deemed guilty by the IRS of a thought crime. A thought crime is an occurrence or instance of controversial or socially unacceptable thoughts. The term is also used to describe some theological concepts such as disbelief or idolatry, or a rejection of strong social or philosophical principles. Plaintiff [believes] THE CODE is more moralistic than mathematical.
